A display in the college foyer and some particularly interesting classroom visits conducted by Mrs Hayward also allowed students to learn more about traditional Aboriginal culture and appreciate its invaluable place in Australian society.



Showcase Day

Showcase Day took place in late July and once again provided an important opportunity for teachers to give visiting Year 10 students a realistic and engaging introduction to courses offered at the college. Showcase Day is considered the first official chance for on-site transition of future students from our main feeder schools, including Cannington Community College and Yule Brook College.

Book Club



The newly formed Sevenoaks Senior College Book Club met for the first time on Thursday 21 July and the session served to introduce students to the concept of sharing their reading experiences with each other in a relaxed and friendly environment.

The Book Club, open to all students and staff, involves monthly meetings which provide an ideal opportunity to discuss what participants are reading outside of their school studies and to access or offer recommendations. Members are welcome to pursue reading in any areas or styles of personal interest, but they will also be offered several specific recommendations and these have so far included texts such as *Animal Farm* by George Orwell and *The Book Thief* by Markus Zusak.

Sevenoaks Senior College embraces the philosophy that regular, independent reading at home has the potential to dramatically increase literacy levels as well as fulfil the need for students to engage in a pleasurable, productive activity as part of a balanced lifestyle. Dates of future Book Club meetings throughout term three are Thursday lunchtimes on August 18 and September 13.

Integrated Science

Year 12 Integrated Science students are learning about rocketry and have consolidated their learning through exciting practical exercises involving the construction and launching of different types of rockets. They have made their own bottle rockets and individually designed matchstick rockets. During the activities, students studied the chemistry behind the chemical reactions of the propellant used to move the bottle rockets and were able to explain the forces overcome by Newton's 3rd Law of Motion. These concrete applications of theoretical principles often serve as the highlight of science lessons and students thoroughly enjoyed watching their rockets take to the sky.



Careers Advice

Advice on career options has been a focus throughout term three, as reflected in the display currently exhibited in the college foyer. The visually engaging display clearly identifies the qualifications which can be earned either through the TAFE sector or within a chosen industry. Students can follow the areas of training from Certificate II through to Advanced Diploma or Associate Degree. Careers advice is always available for students seeking

to pursue qualifications in fields such as Aero skills, Animal Care and Management, Automotive Manufacturing, Aviation, Beauty and Hairdressing, Business Services, Community Services, Information and Communications Technology, amongst many other options.

Students are reminded that university applications must be finalised by Friday 23 September and TAFE applications completed by the end of October. Students are urged to see Careers Co-ordinator Mrs Brenda Earl before they sign any contracts with private RTO providers offering certificates.
