Dignitaries, parents, teachers and friends were on hand to congratulate our Year 12 students as they received their certificates and awards.

This year students at the College participated in a vast number of activities that promoted and developed active citizenship, cultural understandings, innovation and enterprise, leadership, respect, collaboration, team work and social skills. Our well known Harmony Day Festival, the Year 12 Ball, NAIDOC week celebrations, our Health and Wellbeing initiatives and Sevenoaks' Got Talent fundraiser, which provided students with opportunities to enjoy each others' company, learn about each other and grow as young people. Our College sporting teams (volleyball, soccer, netball, table tennis and AFL) all achieved some terrific results and individually, many students participated in organised community sports.

Our enrolments for 2019 are very strong and we are very pleased with the increasing number of ATAR students who now seek Sevenoaks as a destination because of our broad range of courses and the quality of our teachers. Importantly, both Year 11 and Year 12 students will be given two opportunities in 2019 to meet the OLNA requirements for WACE achievement. Early next year we will conduct a Parent Evening, where the WACE requirements will once again be presented to parents and students.

2018 has been a terrific year and I hope that staff and students have some time to reflect on our busy year and enjoy the achievements that we have all accomplished. Reflections on a Wonderful Career

It is with mixed emotions that we say farewell to Vice Principal David Proctor (pictured below, right) at the end of this term as he embarks on his well-deserved retirement. David has worked for the Department of Education for forty one years in a variety of roles including as a Chemistry and Physics teacher, Head of Science, Deputy Principal and now as Vice Principal. David is also a published author of high quality Chemistry revision guides that have been used by school students throughout Western Australia. David has enriched the lives of country students as well as metropolitan, serving a lengthy teaching post in Katanning in rural W.A. Amongst the most memorable of experiences during this time is when it snowed while he was on yard duty! David is an inaugural staff member of Sevenoaks, beginning as a Chemistry and Physics teacher in 2001, before being merit selected to the position of Student Services Coordinator in 2004 and College Operations Coordinator in 2005. He has served the students and the community of Sevenoaks Senior College as Vice Principal since 2006. In fact, David's connection to the local area dates back to 1925 when his father started his own education at Cannington Primary School, which is now the site of Carousel. In reflecting on his impressive career, David appreciates that life as an educator is "never boring, never dull" and he has particularly enjoyed working with students "who are individuals", explaining that "individually they have a lot of character and charisma". Some of David's fondest and most rewarding moments are when former students recognise him, sometimes decades after they have finished school, and thank him for his role in their education. We wish David all the best for a wonderful retirement and thank him sincerely for his valuable contributions to Sevenoaks College and education in Western Australia.



Poetry Slam

Sevenoaks students recently participated in a highly entertaining and engaging poetry The event featured Kai Schweizer, winner of the 2017 WA Poetry Slam Final, who performed two very powerful poems and discussed slam poetry with students.
