From the Acting Principal

Term Two has so far been a very productive one; while concerns about Covid-19 at the end of last term presented numerous challenges for Sevenoaks' students and staff – indeed, for the global community at large – we are very pleased to have been able to resume teaching and learning with some sense of normality here at the College from the beginning of this term. Students and teachers alike are pleased that contact sport and smaller excursions have recommenced in recent weeks. Attendance is back on track and most students are engaging very well with their courses. We are very proud of the resilience displayed by our students over recent months and we encourage them to continue to make the most of every situation that is presented to them.

Some assessment outlines have undergone modifications in line with those approved by the School Curriculum and Standards Authority (SCSA). The postponed Externally Set Tasks (ESTs) will now take place in Week 9 of this term and the ATAR exams remain scheduled for November. We commend the Year 11 and 12 ATAR students on their earnest approach to completing Semester One course exams throughout Weeks 6 and 7 of the term. A number of OLNA sessions are available for students who still require extra support to attain the minimum literacy and numeracy standard for WACE; the details of these sessions have been provided to students via Advocacy and are detailed on posters throughout the College.

We thank the school's former Vice Principal, David Proctor, for stepping back into this role at the start of the term while I continue to act as the Principal in Dr Kath Partridge's absence. Since week 5 of the term, Fiona

Thomson has taken over as the acting Vice Principal and we also thank her for her hard work in this position. Natasha Georgiou has been acting in the position of Program Coordinator: College Operations and Esther Marriott has been the acting Student Services Coordinator since Week 5. They will remain in these roles for the duration of the term. The College is grateful for the excellent leadership and professionalism of each of these staff members.

Reports will be sent home late this term. The Semester One Report Evening, scheduled for the last Wednesday of term, has been cancelled due to current Covid-19 guidelines. Advocate and classroom teachers will provide support to students and contact caregivers via phone or email to discuss any concerns about individual student progress where necessary. Jordan Thorsager Scholarship Winner

We congratulate Telia Donovan, the winner of a new \$1000 scholarship introduced in 2020. Telia has proved herself to be a very worthy recipient of this generous scholarship, evidenced by her outstanding attendance and commitment to her studies. The scholarship honours the memory of Jordan Thorsager, a former student of Sevenoaks who attended the College in 2012 and 2013. Jordan tragically passed away in a traffic accident at the start of 2019. He is remembered as a friendly, capable and sportloving person who was respected and admired by all who had the privilege of knowing him. Learning from Home

At the end of last term, Sevenoaks teachers worked tirelessly to prepare both digital and hard copy materials to support student learning from home. These resources were made available on Connect or sent to homes as work packages. In fact, the College embarked on its biggest ever mail-out in late March (pictured below). The resources prepared by teachers ensured that students without online access were well-catered for, including those who continued to work from home when the College reopened this term. The home work packages for the *Follow the Dream* students (pictured, right) contained literacy, numeracy and Noongar language booklets. Teachers were careful to make sure that the process of learning from home remained equitable for all students, regardless of whether they used digital or hard copy materials.



The online mode of teaching which many students participated in from home provided a great number of professional learning opportunities for teachers, who rapidly upskilled in their use of technological tools such as WebEx, Zoom, Screen-cast-Omatic, HoverCam and Kahoots. Teachers enjoyed learning about the capability of other ways to deliver content and engage students. Professional development around how to use these technologies is ongoing and many teachers are continuing to implement these tools in their classrooms, even now that face-to-face teaching has resumed. We commend Sevenoaks' students and staff on the adaptability and flexibility they have shown in teaching and learning under quite different and sometimes challenging circumstances this year.





Good Hygiene

Students and staff are required to exercise good hygiene and all classrooms are equipped with hand sanitiser and cleaning products to enable this. Students are encouraged to clean their hands before they enter classrooms and when they leave, as well as to regularly and thoroughly wash their hands throughout the day. Extra cleaning, particularly in high touch areas, is occurring throughout the day at the College. A number of informative posters have been placed throughout the College as a visible guide of good hygiene practices. We also remind students that they should not be sharing food, drinks or cutlery.
